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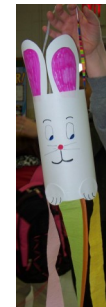
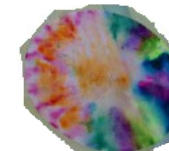

4-H is a **community** of **young people** across **America** who are learning **leadership, citizenship** and **life skills.**

Who Can Join?

Any child ages 5 to 18. Children 5 to 8 can join 4-H Cloverbud Clubs. Youth ages 9 to 18 are eligible for junior and senior 4-H clubs.

What Does 4-H Offer?
